BOULDER DAM-LAS VEGAS-DEATH VALLEY

BOULDER DAM STOPOVER TOUR **\$8.00**

Passengers are met at the airport by luxurious limousine and, after sight-seeing tour of Las Vegas, leave for Boulder Dam, 30 miles distant. After tour of the interior of the Dam and Power House, party is taken for a 12-mile cruise on Lake Mead to upstream face of Dam. Return trip in time for evening departure.

ALL-DAY TOUR TO GRAND CANYON **\$17.00**

Same as above, except that the boat cruise consists of a spectacular 200-mile trip on Lake Mead—through Black, Boulder, Virgin and Grand Wash Canyons—past Temple Bar, Napoleon's Tomb and other breath-taking rock formations—into the lower reaches of the Grand Canyon itself. Lunch served on boat.

TWO-DAY BOULDER DAM-DEATH VALLEY TOUR **\$46.50**

(ALL EXPENSE)

Complete tour of Boulder Dam, same as above, plus trip by private limousine past ghost cities of Bullfrog and Rhyolite, entering Death Valley through Hell's Gate. After spending the night at luxurious Furnace Creek Inn, party is taken for tour of Valley next day. Return trip includes luncheon at Mt. Charleston Lodge, high in the "desert alps." Tour concludes with dinner at popular Las Vegas night club and tour of gaming resorts, before departure to airport. For \$7.10 extra, a side-trip can be made to Death Valley Scotty's Castle, including admission to castle.

CORONADO-TIJUANA-AGUA CALIENTE

Three-and-one-half-hour Tanner tour from San Diego to Mexican border, passing the U. S. Destroyer Base en route. Then to picturesque town of Tijuana and race track at Agua Caliente. (1939 racing season starts on Thanksgiving Day.) Return trip is by way of the famed Silver Strand and Coronado, then by ferry to San Diego.

SAN DIEGO AND POINT LOMA
