

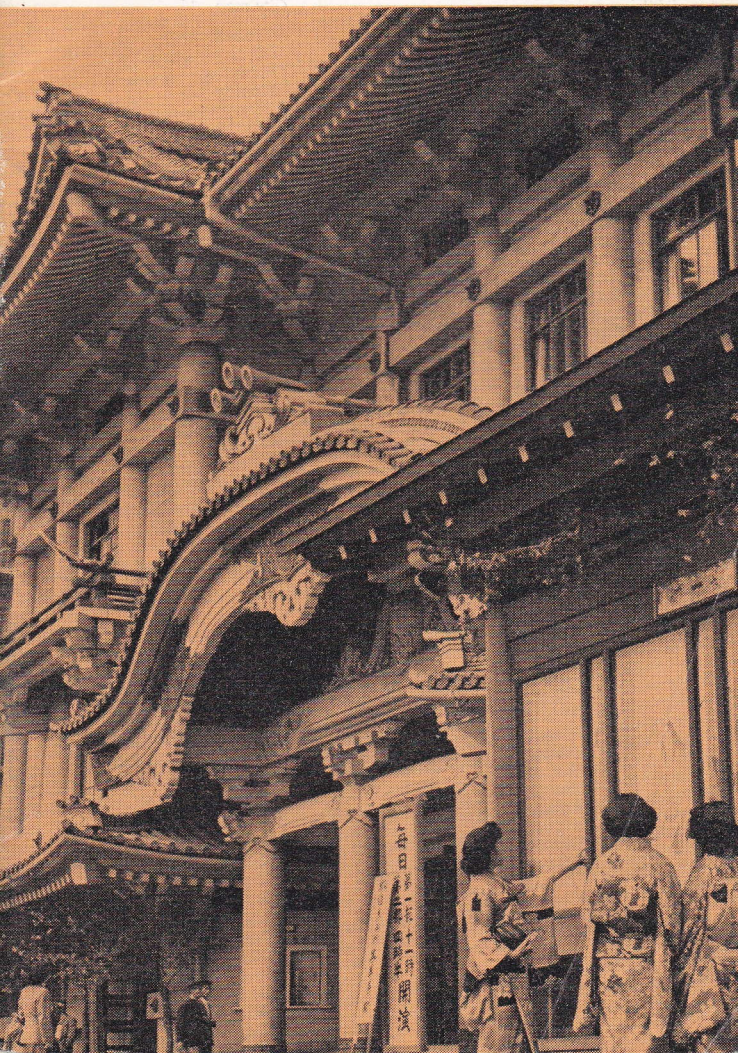


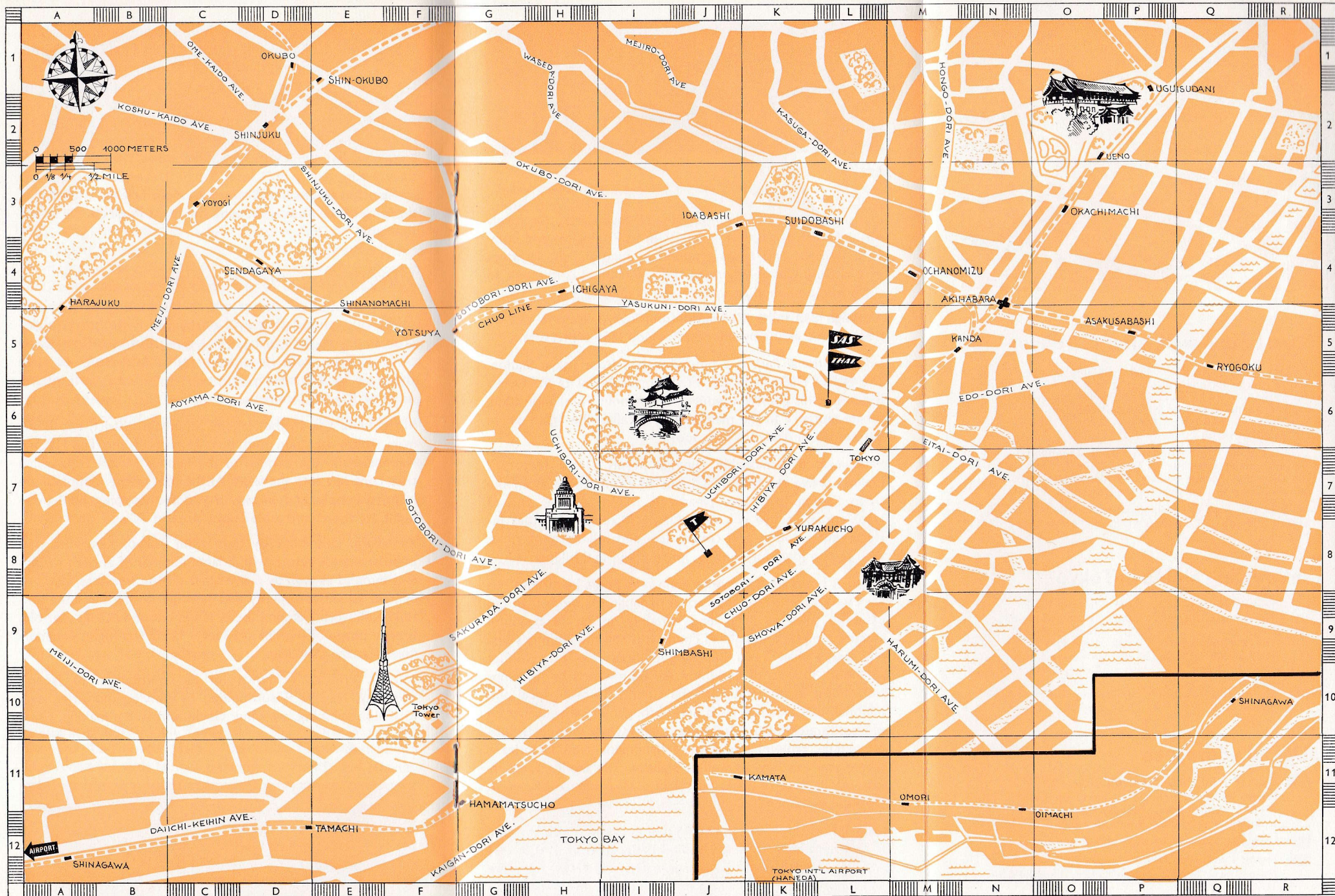
# Tokyo

SAS CITY PORTRAIT

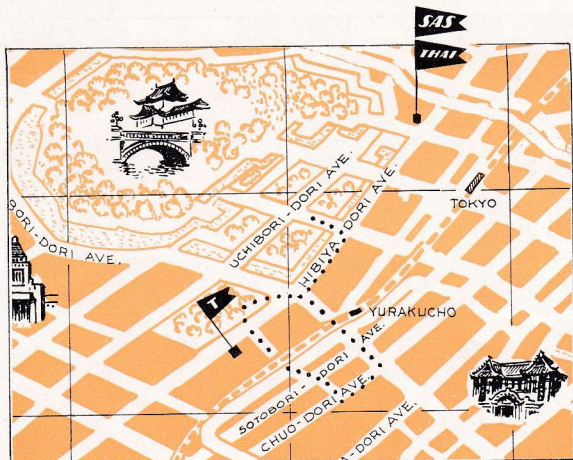


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Code numbers in this booklet refer to the above map. Thus (J8) is located where lines drawn from "J" and "8" cross each other.



## One hour's walk around Tokyo

Start at the Imperial Hotel and walk through the colorful Hibiya Park to Imperial Palace. Stop for a moment to admire the beautiful old pine trees which dot the Imperial grounds. Walking to the corner of Hibiya-dori and Harumi-dori avenues, you will find one of the best shopping arcades in the city in the Nikkatsu Building.

Continue down Harumi-dori Avenue to Chuo-dori Avenue, the main shopping center of Tokyo. Turn to your right on the Chuo-dori Avenue passing the Matsuzakaya Department Store and turn to your right on the first corner.

On your way back to the Imperial Hotel, you will pass the Theatrical district where the cinemas and revue theaters are located.

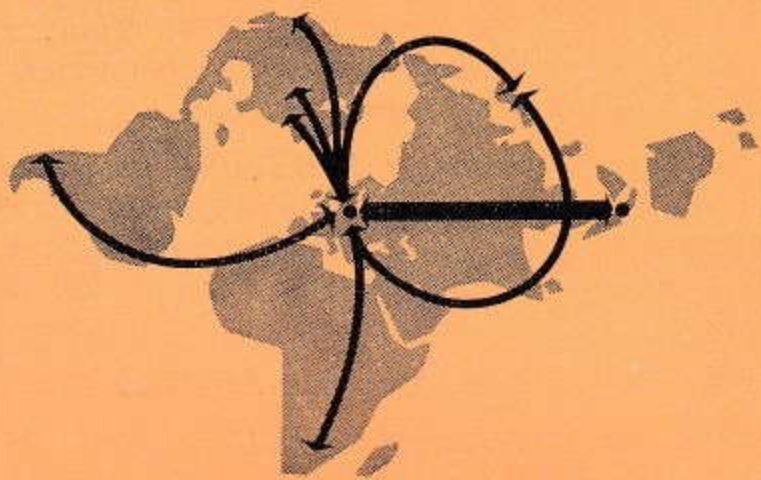
