GENERAL PASSENGER INFORMATION

Alcoholic Beverages — Federal Aviation Agency regulations provide that no person may drink alcoholic beverages aboard an aircraft unless they have been served by the airline and no airline may serve such beverages to any person who appears to be intoxicated.

Baggage Allowance — (Per passenger) 1 piece of baggage with linear dimensions (length + height + width) not exceeding 62 inches, plus 1 piece of baggage with linear dimensions not exceeding 55 inches. One or more additional pieces, totaling no more than 45 inches may be carried on board provided it fits beneath the seat or in an approved carry-on compartment. Approximate dimensions not to exceed 9 x 13 x 23. In addition to size, each piece must not exceed 40 pounds.

Baggage Liability — Baggage should be clearly tagged with your name and address. Liability for baggage for trips between points in the U.S. will not exceed \$500.00 per ticket unless you declare a higher valuation and pay a slight extra charge. Excess valuation cannot be declared for certain checked valuable items such as jewelry, negotiable instruments, currency and antiques. For international trips, liability will not exceed \$9.07 per pound for checked baggage and \$400 per passenger for unchecked baggage unless you declare a higher value and pay an extra charge.

Checked Baggage — Car keys, pills, critical medicine or other items necessary for your health or well-being should remain in carry-on luggage whenever possible, as baggage, checked prior to departure, is generally unavailable again until claimed at your destination.

Credit Cards — Atlas Airlines accepts American Express, BankAmericard, Carte Blanche, Diners Club, Mastercharge, and Universal Air Travel Cards.

Electronic Devices — Federal Aviation regulations prohibit in flight operation of electronic device other than portable voice recorders or electronic calculators, electric watches, hearing aids, heart pacemakers and electric shavers. Other electronic devices (including AM and FM broadcast receivers) may interfere with the navigation or communications systems of the aircraft.

Responsibility for Departures, Arrivals, Connections — Atlas Airlines will not be responsible for damages resulting from the failure to depart or arrive at times stated in this timetable, nor for errors herein, nor for failure to make connections with planes of other lines or of this Company Schedules subject to change without notice. Safety is our primary consideration. Schedule time published include allowances for variations in wind direction and velocity, planned ground movement of the aircraft between runway and gates and similar factors to assure gate arrival within 15 minutes of published schedule more than 75% on the time. Schedules do not allow for abnormal air traffic and ground delays which cannot be forecast in advance.

Restricted Articles — Acid, matches, lighter fluid and hazardous articles MUST NOT BE PACKED IN BAGGAGE.
