PICK-UP AND DELIVERY SERVICE—Rates include special pick-up and delivery service by Postal Telegraph. Call nearest Postal Office for pick-up service. All shipments delivered immediately upon arrival of plane at destination. Twenty-four hour service available, including Sundays and Holidays.

CLASSES OF SERVICE—Shipments may be sent prepaid or collect.

EXTENT OF SERVICE IN U. S.—Shipments will be accepted for air delivery to any city served by Eastern Air Transport or other airlines.

AIR-RAIL SERVICE—Air-rail shipments are handled to and from 23,000 cities and towns not directly on the routes of General Air Express lines.

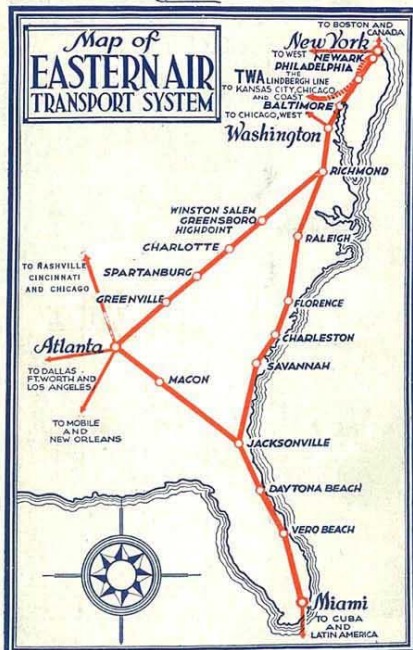

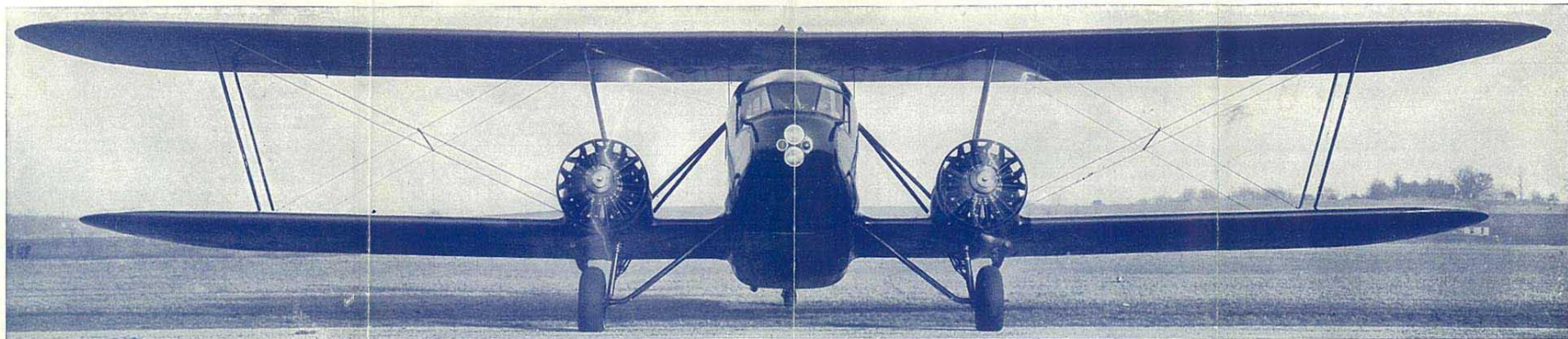

GENERAL INFORMATION

Reservations.—Must be made and accepted in advance. The return portions of round-trip tickets will not be honored for passage unless reservation has been made.

Cancellations—By Company.—The Company reserves the right to cancel bookings before passage or en route whenever such action is deemed advisable or necessary. In all events, the passenger's sole recourse shall be recovery of the unused portion of the air fare.

Cancellations—By Passenger.—To secure refund, ticket must be surrendered to company office three hours before scheduled departure; when departure is scheduled before 10.00 A.M., cancellation must be made before 6.00 P.M. the previous day. Refunds will not be made except under these conditions.

Tickets.—Good for ninety days from date of issue. On sale at all company offices, leading hotels and travel bureaus, at all Postal Telegraph offices and Western Union offices without extra cost. See "For Information and Reservations."

Children.—Children in arms under two years of age will be carried free. All others at regular fare.

Ground Transportation.—Fares do not include ground transportation to and from airports, which is available at all stations at reasonable cost. See "Ground Transportation."

Animals.—No animals, birds or reptiles may be transported in passenger planes.

Baggage.—Thirty pounds of baggage per passenger carried free (all bags, brief cases and packages will be weighed as baggage). Excess baggage, if plane load allows charged for at approximately 1/2 of 1% of the full passenger tariff. Minimum charge for excess baggage is 25c. Not more than 50 pounds of baggage per passenger will be carried unless previous arrangement has been made. Company personnel will gladly assist passengers in making arrangements to ship excess baggage by express or freight.

Stop-overs.—Permitted on all tickets. Passenger assumes responsibility for securing reservation to resume journey. Passage between immediately adjacent stations subject to space available at time of plane departure.

Schedules and Fares.—Subject to change without notice.

Connections.—Every effort will be made to make connections shown, but the Company will be in no way liable for failure to do so.

Equipment.—Only multi-motored equipment is used for transporting passengers. Eastern Air Transport operates 15 and 18 passenger twin-motored Curtiss Condors, 10 passenger tri-motored Stinsons and 6 passenger twin-motored Curtiss Kingbirds on passenger schedules.
